Mr. Lamont gave the invocation and Vice Chairman Beach called the meeting to order at approximately 2:08 p.m.

<u>MINUTES</u>: The minutes from the Regular Meeting held on December 5, 2023 and the Special Call Meeting held on January 11, 2024 were presented to the Authority for approval. Upon a motion made by Mayor Bodker, which was seconded by Mr. Lamont, the Authority approved the minutes as presented.

<u>APPROVAL OF MEETING AGENDA</u>: Upon a motion made by Mayor Bodker, which was seconded by Ms. Long, the Authority unanimously approved the meeting agenda as presented.

<u>PUBLIC COMMENTS:</u> Mr. Jim Martin appeared in person to share comments on Item H.1. of the agenda, in accordance with the Authority's Public Comments Procedures. Additionally, Vice Chairman Beach announced that the Authority's staff received public comments via email, copies of which are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Supplemental Bond Resolution for Georgia Tech Athletic Association ("GTAA") (Address: 150 Bobby Dodd Way, N.W., Atlanta, Georgia). Ms. Caryl Smith of Hunton Andrews Kurth LLP and Ms. Tanesha Steward and Mr. Brad Stricklin of the Georgia Institute of Technology ("Georgia Tech") appeared in

connection with the request to approve the supplemental bond resolution for the issuance of \$34,060,000 in federally taxable and tax-exempt bonds to finance (i) the construction of an approximately 96,000 square foot state-of-the-art student athlete performance center to house strength and conditioning space, a dining hall and nutrition center, a dedicated sports science and data analytics areas, a sports medicine and recovery room, and new programming spaces for football players, coaches, and staff, and (ii) the renovation and improvements of the Wardlaw Center and several other areas in Bobby Dodd Stadium to provide space for personnel and activities during construction, to be located at 150 Bobby Dodd Way, N.W. in the City of Atlanta. More specific details are described in the Fact Sheet included as part of this item posted on the Authority's website. Upon a motion made by Dr. Looney, which was seconded by Ms. Long, the Authority unanimously approved the final bond resolution for GTAA.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Letter of Inducement and Final Bond Resolution for X Corp., a Nevada Corporation ("X Corp.") (Address: 1025 Jefferson Street, NW, Atlanta, Georgia). Mr. Woody Vaughan and Ms. Allison Dyer of Holland & Knight LLP and Mr. Dhruv Batura of X Corp. appeared in connection with the request for a letter of inducement and final bond resolution in the amount of \$700,000,000 for the acquisition, installation and creation of the next generation of high-performance computing and Artificial Intelligence (AI) products for the X platform. Mr. Vaughan and Mr. Batura confirmed the requested transaction is for equipment only, and the project is in competition with Portland and other locations as AI technology hubs. There would be 24 retained jobs and 50 indirect jobs. The company is exploring partnerships with local businesses as well as internship programs in order to build a pipeline of talent. Additional discussion and comments were offered by Mr. Hall, Dr. Looney, Mayor Bodker, Ms. Kurlander-Nagel and Ms. Long.

Mr. Hall made a motion to approve the letter of inducement and final bond resolution for X Corp., and Mayor Bodker seconded. Vice Chairman Beach opened the floor for additional discussion and position statements, and Ms. Kurlander-Nagel, Dr. Looney, Mr. Hall, Ms. Cole, Mr. Lamont, Mayor Bodker, Ms. Long and Vice Chairman Beach each provided additional comments. Dr. Looney made a friendly amendment to the motion to find a mutually agreeable path forward on corporate citizenship and Mr. Hall accepted the friendly amendment. The amended motion to approve the letter of inducement and final bond resolution for X Corp., subject to a satisfactory agreement on corporate citizenship, was approved, with Vice Chairman Beach, Mr. Hall, Dr. Looney, Mayor Bodker, Ms. Cole and Ms. Kurlander-Nagel voting yes, and Ms. Long and Mr. Lamont voting no.

#### ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/APPROVAL:

Election of Chairman. Vice Chairman Beach stated this election for Chairman would fill the unexpired term of late Chairman Turpeau until June 2024, and in June there will be a full election for all officer positions. Dr. Looney moved to nominate Vice Chairman Beach for the Chairman position, and Ms. Kurlander-Nagel seconded. Mr. Lamont nominated Mr. Hall to fill the Chairman position, and Ms. Cole seconded. Vice Chairman Beach and Mr. Hall each offered statements regarding priorities for the Authority and his ability to serve in the role of Chairman. The initial vote was 4-4, with Vice Chairman Beach, Dr. Looney, Ms. Kurlander-Nagel and Mayor Bodker voting for Vice Chairman Beach, and Mr. Hall, Ms. Cole, Ms. Long and Mr. Lamont voting for Mr. Hall. After additional discussion, a second vote was held and Vice Chairman Beach was elected Chairman, with Vice Chairman Beach, Dr. Looney, Ms. Kurlander-Nagel, Mayor Bodker and Mr. Hall voting for Vice Chairman Beach, and Ms. Cole, Ms. Long and Mr. Lamont voting for Mr. Hall. As permitted by the Authority's Bylaws, Chairman Beach appointed Mr. Hall to serve as Vice Chairman until the next regular meeting when a vote for the Vice Chairman position will occur.

## REPORTS AND PRESENTATIONS:

<u>Legislative Update</u>. Ms. Langford offered brief comments on the status of legislation of interest to the Authority, including virtual meeting bills.

<u>Update from the Executive Director</u>. Ms. Langford stated that the Board of Commissioners had a proclamation for the late Chairman Turpeau. Looking ahead to February, Ms. Langford reported she will attend an economic development forum with Georgia Power and a Board of Assessors work session where treatment of Authority-owned projects is expected to be discussed. She also reported that one of the South Fulton projects approved by the Authority will not be moving forward due to economic and other factors and reminded the Authority not to take economic development opportunities for granted.

#### Committee Updates.

On behalf of the Executive Committee, Chairman Beach stated that the Committee had nothing to report at this time.

On behalf of the Financial Review/Audit Committee, Mayor Bodker reported briefly on discussions with the Board of Assessors and the upcoming work session. He also reported the Authority is ahead of last year's budget, due to controlled expenses by staff and an increase in economic development opportunities. Mayor Bodker commented on the end of year surplus in 2023 and asked the Board to give thought to the percentages to be distributed towards general strategic initiatives and the other permitted uses of surplus in accordance with the Authority's Budget Policy.

On behalf of the Strategic Initiative Committee, Mr. Lamont stated that the Committee had nothing to report at this time.

On behalf of the MFBE Committee, Ms. Long stated that the Committee had nothing to report at this time. Ms. Bryan confirmed that the first surveys for the automated MFBE Report have gone out and staff will be monitoring responses and making necessary tweaks to support the next level of automation.

#### **NEXT MEETING:**

Chairman Beach announced that the Authority's next Regular Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 27, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. and reminded the public to visit the Authority's website at <a href="http://www.developfultoncounty.com">http://www.developfultoncounty.com</a> for updates on upcoming meetings. The Board will be polled for a special call meeting to be held on February 8.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Mayor Bodker, seconded by Vice Chairman Hall, and approved by all Members present.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 3:34 p.m.

# An Analysis of X Corp. Tax Incentive Benefits to Fulton County

# Summary:

- The refit of the datacenter space leased by X Corp in Fulton County will not yield the benefit it claims, because the vast majority of typical local economic benefit from data centers is from new construction, which will not occur with this refit
- The business relationship between X Corp and Fulton County is valuable and mutually beneficial, and we should both work to preserve
- Atlanta and Fulton County are poised to lead the burgeoning Al industry
- Recommendation: X Corp can benefit Fulton County and earn this incentive by advertising that their Al models are trained and operated here in Fulton County (e.g. "Atlanta Made" or "Georgia Made")

# Analysis:

The metro Atlanta area is earning its reputation as a global datacenter hub due to its strong power and connectivity infrastructure, inexpensive land, low natural disaster risk, and favorable business climate ("Atlanta data center real estate market"). With the widespread business interest in hyperscale operations like AI, demand and development is only continuing to grow (Miller). As with all business, datacenters benefit the local economy both directly and indirectly; however, national expert studies show that the majority of this economic benefit comes from new datacenters, specifically in construction. As such, the proposed \$700,000,000 investment by the X Corp. to "acquire, install and create the next generation of high-performance computing and Artificial Intelligence (AI) products for the X platform," will yield nowhere near the \$1,093,570,103 of economic impact suggested by X Corp., but there may be other ways X Corp can justify its tax exemption to Fulton County.

Modeling economic impact from data centers has been the subject of many studies, including "The Impact of Data Centers on the Georgia Economy" from Magnum Economics and "Economic, Environmental, and Social Impacts of Data Centers in the United States" from PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC). Both of these studies show that, on a local and national level, the overwhelming majority of economic impact of datacenters on local economies is due to (1) the cost of construction) and (2) the direct and indirect labor associated with construction. When studying impact of all of the data centers in Virginia, the largest datacenter market in the country, in 2021 PwC's report found that 93.6% of revenue (\$13.5 Billion) came from construction and labor impact, while less than 6.5% of the impact was from taxes. Based on the findings from these reports, as the X Corp refit will amount only to the tax on these low operating costs, the economic benefit to the local community will be a small fraction of what they suggest.

While the projections from this proposal are inaccurate, the business partnership between X Corp. and Fulton County is valuable, and given that X Corp has been using Atlanta data centers for many years it would be mutually beneficial for this partnership to continue. The likelihood that X Corp.'s consideration of pulling out of their Atlanta data center is not an empty threat; it has been well documented that new management in X Corp has focused on cutting expenses (Dang et al.), and that has included the closing of a data center in Sacramento, CA (Deutscher). My experience in the field of AI has shown me that corporations with unique, large quantities of data have an advantage in the development of AI. As a result, I strongly believe that X Corp. is uniquely well-positioned to have an outsized impact on AI technology.

This is important because Atlanta is extremely well positioned to be a large presence in the AI space. Atlanta is a data hub that already hosts nearly all of the biggest global AI corporations, is and AI research powerhouse built around Georgia Tech and GTRI, and has a massive pool of young talent, graduating over 1500 computer science undergrads every year not to mention an additional 2500 from Georgia Tech's online masters program ("The Computer & Information Sciences Major at Georgia Institute of Technology - Main Campus"). With local, tangible investment from corporate partners like X Corp., Atlanta could emerge as an AI powerhouse.

What remains unanswered is, "What arrangement between X Corp. and Fulton County would actually benefit the people and future of the Atlanta Metro Area?" While I understand that X Corp.'s investment in AI technology has some benefits, it is clear that the benefit to local Georgians is small. Something that is valuable to local Georgians and would cost X Corp nothing, however, would be to act as a standard-bearer for Atlanta as an AI hub. For example, the film industry credits our great state by adding "Georgia Film" at the end of every film. I propose that if X Corp. wants incentives to train and operate their AI in Georgia they label their AI as "Georgia Made." With this, corporations everywhere interested in AI will recognize Atlanta, Fulton County, and Georgia as the global AI hub it can be.

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Dear Board of Development Authority of Fulton County,

Hope that this note finds you well. I am writing to convey my opposition to the final bond resolution to X Corp, for the following reasons:

- The ongoing investment of \$700,000 does not appear to be the most prudent return, given the greater than \$10 million savings that X Corp will receive. The over \$1 Billion economic impact that is claimed is not going to lead to increased spending in the local area. As Druv, from X, mentioned, the equipment is not manufactured or deigned in Fulton county and there is no proven benefit to MBEs or FBEs.
- This allocation should be saved for another project that supports more jobs, that can actually improve local communities though spending at local business, moving into the local area, etc.
- X Corp and QTS did not reach out to the adjacent Knight Park/Howell Station Neighborhood Association prior to this request, even though that it the community most affected by this development.
- Fulton county residents should not be footing the bill for higher taxes or have to face reduced services, due to lost tax revenue, to help a company that is privately owned by the worlds wealthiest man.
- X Corp states that if this is not approved, then the jobs risk being moved to Portland. They are clearly not invested in the local community and are just seeking to save money rather than really care about the community they operate out of.

The board's website includes a "why we serve" paragraph, which highlights the following: "to help those who love our metro area and want to be a part of it by investing in its future. Let's work together to continue to foster strong economies and create even stronger communities". X Corp clearly does not love our metro area, if they are threatening to move jobs out of state, and this large abatement does not appear to strengthen the local community,
