Authority, in partnership with Fulton County
Government, expanded its mission to provide wideranging economic development services on behalf of
Fulton County. The Development Authority also funds
community based economic development initiatives.

On a sterling reputation for innovation and service excellence, the Development Authority of Fulton

County has become the preeminent development authority in the southeastern United States.

The Development Authority of Fulton County has issued more than \$16 billion in bonds and helped well over 300 businesses and institutions build, renovate, expand or relocate in Fulton County. The agency serves clients of all sizes, from small, entrepreneurial enterprises to major corporations and institutions. Projects funded have endowed everything from education, health care and transportation to arts and culture.

Cordial professionalism attention to detail, and satisfied business partners are hallmarks of the Development Authority.

The Authority's jurisdiction encompasses all of unincorporated Fulton County and its municipalities, including the city of Atlanta. The Authority works closely with other state and local development organizations as well as with area chambers of commerce. The Authority is a charter member of the Joint Development Authority of Metropolitan Atlanta.

The Year in Review Delivering Quality Growth

2012 brought the creation or retention of approximately 1,484 jobs throughout Fulton

County, thanks to capital projects funded through the Development Authority of Fulton County. From construction jobs associated with renovations and new facilities, to permanent positions in

retail, employment linked to

manufacturing, education, recreation, office, and

County and accounting for the creation or retention of 1,006 projected jobs. With 7 bond issues completed, project financing for 2012 totaled \$380 million, affecting a projected 1,484 jobs. This investment activity was projected to

generate millions in new tax revenue for Fulton County.

Capital Fund took root in 2012. Certified by the U.S.

Treasury as a Community Development Entity, the fund's establishment allowed the Development

Authority to participate in the federal New Markets

Tax Credit Program, which offers tax credit opportu-

nities to investors in underserved communities.

The Development Authority's Georgia Development

The Development Authority extended its participation in the Joint Development Authority of Metropolitan Atlanta during 2012, partnering with neighboring economic development entities to market the region and promote quality economic growth. The Authority is a member of the Georgia Chamber of Commerce, the Metro Atlanta Chamber, and the International Economic Development Council, which certifies economic development professionals worldwide. It works closely with the Georgia Department of Industry, Trade and Tourism to bring new businesses and industries to Fulton County.

Bond Inducements

In 2012, the Development Authority entertained 5 bond Inducement Resolutions, representing more than \$113.7 million in capital improvement projects within Fulton County and accounting for the creation or retention of a projected 1,006 jobs.

By comparison, Inducement Resolutions for 2011 reflected **565.6 million** in potential capital improvement projects within Fulton County, accounting for the creation or retention of a projected **2,587 jobs. Inducement resolutions in 2010** numbered 13, representing more than **\$904 million** in capital improvement projects affecting **8,435 projected jobs**.

Bond Issues Completed

Project financing obtained through bonds issued in 2012 by the Development Authority totaled \$380 million, creating or retaining approximately 1,484 temporary and permanent jobs within Fulton County.

By comparison, bonds issued by the Development Authority in 2011 totaled \$224.8 million, creating or retaining a projected 972 jobs within Fulton County. For 2010, the totals were \$818.5 million and an estimated 6,824 jobs created or retained.

Projects funded by bonds issued in 2012 are projected to generate millions in new tax revenue to Fulton County.

Partners in Regional Economic Development

Joint Development Authority of Metropolitan Atlanta

he Development Authority of Fulton

County worked collaboratively with development authorities in the neighboring counties

of Clayton, DeKalb,
Rockdale and Henry
under the
auspices of the
Joint
Development
Authority of
Metropolitan
Atlanta. The
combined population of

the participating counties represents nearly one-fourth of Georgia's population.

Pursuing a regional approach to economic development, the Joint Development Authority

provided a forum for the exchange of best practices and for member authorities to address diverse issues—from unified marketing strategies and support of pro-development legislation, to educational outreach and initiatives that address local issues affecting regional growth.

The Joint Development Authority of Fulton
County's participation in the Joint Development
Authority allowed each company locating within its
jurisdiction to earn a state tax credit of \$2,500
for each qualified new job each year for five years.

The Joint Development Authority's Board of Directors met quarterly at sites hosted by member development authorities. Bebert J. Shaw, chairman of the Development Authority of Fulton County, served as chairman of the Joint Development Authority in 2012.
